I don't know that these highway thoughts will mature to anything, but they do remind me that a mind set free makes room for other deeper ruminations.

Gazing up at the towering wind-crafted sandstone structure known as The Three Gossips of Arches National Park, I'm reminded of the cosmic scale of things and "who is humankind that You are mindful of them." I'm awestruck and humbled.

We all need space in our lives but it's hard to come by. You all gave me a great gift and I want you to know how grateful I am.

We integrated vacations into our working lives for a reason. But we don't have to wait for vacations to be gifted with inspirations (great or small). They're the fruit of quieting, of evicting rapid-fire listing and solving and inventorying, and connecting with that exercise that draws us into unthinking spaciousness where another Voice can claim our attention and the Light of inspiration can shine through.

I wonder if I were more intentional about entering these moments of reflection I'd discover that I've reason to wail like Peter for the ways in which I betray the life Christ offers me. Or, that I'd be ignited by some insight that, if enacted, could effect something important. What are my missed confessions? my shunned obediences? What might my life look like, really, if I spent just a little more unthinking time, giving the Spirit of God space to speak? I ponder this in light of the role I have as your pastor and how I might better serve you (and God!).

You know how often we see folks gathered together, each of them busily tapping on their cell phones, not attending to each other? I wonder if that isn't how I appear to God. There God is, sitting right beside me and I with my head down, my eyes focused, my fingers tapping away on that little rectangular device, oblivious to who it is would like a word.

As we gear up again to attend to the things we've committed to as a church, I'm making a commitment to you: to set aside more frequently that "phone" of distraction in favor of unthinking space so that God, more frequently, can get a word in edgewise.

I look forward to being with you all again--and excited to discover what's in store for us as a community.

It's finally happened! Your 'child', the Northeast Portland Backpack Lunch Program has grown up into -Portland Backpack- and has moved out of the house. Portland Backpack is now an independent nonprofit organization!

It's like parenting when you do such a good job that your child is ready to be on their own. It's a sad and happy thing when our child grows up and moves away. That's what we wanted all along, but the house seems a little quiet.

In the nine years of Backpack being a program of Fremont United Methodist Church hundreds of congregants have contributed, time, talent and treasure. Under Marilyn Mauch's visionary leadership more than 25 people from Fremont UMC volunteered on a regular schedule with the Backpack program, giving hundreds of hours each year. We have stored food bins here at the church, had packing events after church with whole families helping out, had our bookkeeping handled by the office, and been given solid advice and support by church members.

Obviously, Portland Backpack would not exist on its own without Fremont UMC guiding it. Just because Portland Backpack is out on its own now, that doesn't mean that there is no relationship. Fremont should proudly proclaim their role in birthing Portland Backpack! At Portland Backpack we hope that you will still be there for us! We still have 20+ Fremont UMC people as volunteers. We like having you help us pack lunch sacks! Our official address is the church. We store our full bins in the fellowship hall.
