Christian or Christ-ian?

When our youth group was asked recently, "What makes us Christian?" one youth responded with "Isn't everyone Christian who isn't Jewish or Muslim?"

Well, no, not quite. A person might identify themselves as Christian but not be Christian.

There's a lot of religious talk these days--a lot of people waiving a banner of one faith or another elbowing their way to the public forum, trying to out-demonstrate, out-tweet, and in some cases, out-yell those they perceive to be their opponents.

And, on the other hand, there is evidence that people of all walks and circumstances long for a spirituality that can answer their anxiety--they're seeking something authentic--something that resonates with their inner knowing. A whispering Truth that can cut through the din.

This week I came across this sentence in a little book titled *The Gladness of God* by H.V. Miller: We should constantly seek to keep a freshness and a fullness in our religious life so that the overflow will show to a world of heartaches that after all we have an internal something that they need. (I would perhaps say: that they are seeking)

So, how do we cultivate that freshness and maintain that fullness--that holy abundance that can be recognized as the answer to heartaches and spiritual longings?

We're going to explore this question this fall season. Our launching point and guiding verse will be Romans 12:2

Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect.

Society presses upon you to copy dress and manner, thought and value, what will anger or attract you.

Ignore it. It's fear whining for company. It's a shield against celestial radiation.

Tune out the market's frantic clatter.

Be changed by a new way of thinking: not thinking: an opened awareness, a mind of wonder and gratitude and the strangeness of being loved.

Conform to nothing but the grace of God.

Each moment the Mysterious Blessing

dawns in you, allows a newness, sings a song their ears can't hear.
Let the Great Love in you make harmony.
The tune is already there, the ear and the voice.
Let it meld in perfect harmony.
Passersby will hear songs from your door,

from the woods rises music that's lovely, good and beautiful, the delight of God.

New Approach to Adult Education


