# Pastor's Greeting

#### Greetings, Fremont Family:

As Spring approaches, I can almost feel creation leaning toward life. As the days lengthen (the Old English word for Lent), flowers push through the ground, buds appear on the trees, and everything (including me) turns toward the sun. Even though the distribution of vaccines has been slow, more and more of us are getting vaccinated, and life almost feels possible again! Just this week, we received news that our children in PPS will be returning to school in April for some form of hybrid learning. Praise God! There is lots to celebrate, and the same is true at Fremont.

In January, I set for myself and for our congregation some lofty goals. The first goal was to form a Dream Team that would partner with me to discern God's intentions for our future at Fremont (big picture work). The second goal was to finish the Reckoning with Racism co-hort and identify several corporate practices of repentance to reconcile our history with our future. The final goal was to launch the postponed Capital Campaign. I am overjoyed to tell you that we are well on our way toward meeting all three of these goals! On February 16<sup>th</sup>, the Building Design Team at Fremont reconvened to review and prioritize important improvements to the building. As we move forward, we will be sharing with the congregation our hopes for making our building more open, welcoming and technologically modernized, not just for ourselves but for our neighbors and future partners in ministry as well. On February 20<sup>th</sup>, the newly constituted Dream Team held its first meeting. This exceptional group of visionary women is just getting started, and they already deep in the creative process. On February 21<sup>st</sup>, the Capital Campaign Leadership Team met to shift and reframe our Capital Campaign's focus to incorporate affording both our deferred maintenance and our new orientation to neighborhood. These three amazing teams, the Building Design Team, the Dream Team and the Capital Campaign Team, will work in conjunction with each other keeping communication open and aligning their work to collectively move us in the same direction. Finally, the Reckoning with Racism Team continues to meet bimonthly to develop our congregation's land story and to continue to listen and

learn from leaders from around the state of Oregon.

There is so much to look forward to regarding our future life together at Fremont. We are emerging from a long isolation, but God is trustworthy and faithful. I believe that this next season at Fremont will form a crucial foundation for a bright and beautiful future together. May it be so.

### **Juniper School**

I am delighted to share a little about what is happening in our Juniper classroom. At this wonderful time of year we are enjoying our neighborhood walks and eagerly looking for signs that Spring is finally here. We notice the early blooms, the little bulbs poking their heads up and even the birds seem to sing more loudly and be more active.

Juniper is a Waldorf inspired school that has been a part of the Fremont United Methodist community and a building partner for more than twenty years. Imaginative play is the foundation for our program and encouraging respect and empathy for one another and our planet is an integral part of our work together. Like Einstein said, "If you can imagine it, you can make it" At Juniper each child's creative and imaginative capacities are nurtured and cherished. Everyday we are busy baking, sewing, painting, singing, creating stories and puppet shows, playing and exploring ideas together.

Sometimes our attention will focus on a specific idea. Often times the seeds for these ideas begin in a story or an experience that a student shares with the rest of class. We grow and nurture these idea seeds during our "circle time" conversations and throughout the day.

One lunch time recently someone was eating juju berries. Another student decided juju berries couldn't be real as he didn't know where they came from. "Like raspberries grow on a vine" He couldn't believe in juju berries as he also had never seen them at his house. Another boy said, "We don't have to see something to believe in it like I have never seen Ireland but I still believe in it" (That is where I am from) A third chimed in, "Well I believe in fairies and giants and leprechauns because they live in Ireland... but not unicorns." The child (eating the juju berries) beside him replied "I believe in unicorns and I think juju berries are real because I am eating them and they are right here." This was the beginning of many conversations around the big idea of what we believe in.

It did not really matter to most students that the berries were right there on the table but at the time there appeared to be no unicorns present!. Anything is possible in our classroom as the children learn about the world we live in, our place within it and different ways to think and explore the world around them. The well of ideas that children draw from seems to be limitless and I am truly fortunate to be able to share in these conversations. Who knows one day I may bring in some juju berries to share - or maybe not!. However please do let us know if you notice any unicorns or leprechauns about the neighborhood!
